Diabetes: An Opportunity to Have a Lasting Impact on Health Through Lifestyle Modification

TYPE 2 DIABETES (T2D) IS a costly chronic illness that is increasing in prevalence and associated with significant health problems, including cardiovascular disease (CVD).¹ In fact, CVD is listed as the cause of death in nearly 60% of individuals with diabetes.²

Historically, T2D was labeled a "coronary artery disease equivalent" in light of the 7-year risk of myocardial infarction (MI) equating that of a person without diabetes who is post-MI³ in the prestatin-treatment era and the marked improvement in adverse cardiac events with statin therapy.⁴ Given this grave prognosis, and with longstanding work showing diabetes remission from lifestyle interventions as far back as the 1940s,⁵ there is no better and more economical way to treat this epidemic.

Diabetes and CVD share multiple modifiable lifestyle risk factors, such as obesity and physical inactivity, that tend to congregate for many adults, adding to the threat of severe adverse effects already present from a genetic predisposition and other acquired risk factors.^{6,7} In the United States, diabetes affects at least 29.1 million individuals, the equivalent of 9.3% of the entire population and 12.3% of the adult population.⁸ Depending on the cohort surveyed and the definition used, another 5.4 million are estimated to have undiagnosed diabetes.⁹

Differential Weight Loss Effects on Type 2 Diabetes Remission Among Adults

Introduction

Generally, type 2 diabetes (T2D) has been viewed as a chronic, progressive, and controllable, but irreversible, disease.¹ Interventions that occur soon after diagnosis reduce the risk of macro- and microvascular disease and can slow disease progression.² However, plasma glucose continues to increase regardless of the intensity of diabetes control or treatment type.³ Nevertheless, a number of clinical trials and case-control studies have, over time, reported a remission in T2D with bariatric weight loss surgery or with intensive lifestyle management.⁴⁻¹¹

Recently, a retrospective study using a cohort of adults with T2D identified with administrative data from Kaiser Permanente, Northern California, suggested that T2D remissions do occur without bariatric surgery, but are rare.¹² The study found that the cumulative incidences of partial and prolonged diabetes remission over a period of 7 years were 1.5% and 0.007%, respectively.
